- An overview of the PowerTeacher Pro program that is being used for reporting
- An explanation of the indicators being used to describe student achievement
- A "walk through" tour of the online parent portal was provided to help navigate and understand the reporting information found there
- What to expect when using the mobile App versus accessing the Portal using the computer program

In depth discussions were had and comments and questions were shared during the meeting. Council members provided valuable feedback that will be used to enhance the reporting process within the community and across the jurisdiction. Some suggestions were made that will be forwarded to the creators of the program that will help to make it more user friendly. As well, the requests and recommendations from Council will be brought to the meeting of the Assessment and Reporting Committee which will be held at the division office at the end of November. The ongoing dialogue will help to continue to inform the process as we move forward. Jennifer Ferguson will be at the School Council meeting on December 8th to provide a brief update from the Assessment and Reporting Committee and discuss next steps. Thank you to all those that were in attendance. We appreciate your very valuable feedback.

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

Learning Showcase

In case you missed it, the students from the learning commons classes had many of their projects on display during the Learning Showcase on November 22nd. Everything from beadwork, crafting and hand sewing, to robotics, 3-D printing, LEGO, Star Connectors and Tinker Toy builds were displayed for all to enjoy. The students have worked very hard and are looking forward to the upcoming Showcase in the new year.

















Behind the Red Door

This was an especially fun month. The students in grade three all became "Text-Edit Doctors" for an afternoon. We set up operating tables with blue plastic operating sheets and put out surgical tools (scissors, pencils, and glue) in the operating containers. The students donned surgery masks and hair nets and searched through magazines to find the different parts of a text. Once found, the doctors surgically removed each part carefully (cut them out) while listening to the heartbeat on the monitor, and then transplanted the parts into their "Text Person". It was a great way to learn about things such as titles, sub-titles, sidebars, maps, graphs, etc. and how they are used. The students had fun wearing surgical garb and being called doctor. The transplant bodies are laying in recovery (on the bulletin board in the hallway) if you'd like to see them.

We also researched information about Bubble Gum on the internet and made flip books for our parents to enjoy during "Learning Showcase".
