






Leadership Team

WEAR YOUR WORDS



Grade 4/5 Room News

The year is whipping by already and we have been working very hard. Our editing skilld are growing every day, and we have explored many math games to help with building the foundation of math skills. Students would love to challenge their parents to a game of Salute, Facts Battles, Sweet Sixteen, Sum it Up or What's the Difference! Feel free to ask your child about the games, and pull out a deck of cards or six sided dice and have some fun on a cold night inside. We have also focused on vocabulary development through spelling sticks, as well as sight word mastery through spelling addition/multiplication, Boggle and flashcard activities. In Science the Aerogardens are flourishing! It is amazing to see the plants grow and change before our very eyes! The pictures below show our plants at 21 days growth. Students have developed new vocabulary around plant needs, the water cycle, and the nutrient cycle. It is exciting to see the different plants grow. Thank you PASS for your support with this project. We can't wait to eat salad and salsa!

Another area of focus in our room has been on positive Mental Health. Students are engaging in activities such as breathing exercises, coloring, classical music appreciation, and using goal sheets to focus on personal growth. We also have an addictions counselor in to complete the Leaps and Bounds program, with a focus on avoiding tobacco addiction and she will be working with students to support healthy, positive choices.

In Health class, students are learning about basic first aid and what to do in an emergency. Students have also a created a class motto, "We Make Mistakes When We Learn". It is proudly displayed in the classroom to remind us all that we mistakes when we are learning, so we should never be ashamed or upset that we have made them. Little by little we are becoming more confident learners and our successes are growing.

Grade 8/9 Making Math

Grade 8/9 Math Class is working on a City Development Project in conjunction with the Surface Area of 3D objects in Grade 8 and Surface Area of 3D composite objects for Grade 9. Students had to create a city grid system and follow a criteria that we created to build a certain amount of buildings using all of the shapes we have been discussing. They have to keep a separate sheet and calculate the surface area of each building they are building and submit it in the end. Buildings that must be included are a Hospital, Fire Hall, major municipal buildings, a recreation center, and apartment living. Students have been working hard and can't wait to showcase the final projects.

Grade 4-9 CTF Career & Technology Foundations





Students have been diving into their projects this term. We have a multitude of activities the students have been able to chose from. Foods, Maker Space, Sewing, Band, Fitness, Dance, and Art have all been a flurry of excitement over the past few weeks.
