

In our math class, we are learning to add three digit numbers. We are learning to regroup. Ms. Myrol taught us how to do XtraMath on our Chromebooks. This is like the old Mad Minutes, but we get to race The Teacher. We are also doing Daily Math. We do one page of "180 Days of Math" first. We are learning to multiply by 2s and 3s. PowerSchool Parent Portal



Way back in November your child should have brought home a letter explaining how to access the PowerSchool Parent Portal. If you did not receive a letter or have misplaced it, please contact the school. The parent portal will allow parents to log in to see up to date information about how your child is progressing academically. You will be able to view the attendance records, as well as the assignments your child has completed to date and how they did on these assignments. In the letter that was sent home, there is important login and password information to allow you to access the portal. Check our website and click on the Parent Portal Video link, you will be directed to a helpful video that is a How To Guide for the Parent Portal.


