Message from Principal Pfannmuller

It is hard to believe that we are nearing the end of the first month of 2021!! Students and staff have transitioned back into in-person learning successfully after the first week of the new year being online for all learners. We are all pleased to be back in the building together!

Language Arts teachers worked with literacy consultant, Cheryl Gascoyne, to continue to develop their capacity as literacy teachers. Two days were set aside in January for teams of teachers and then individual teachers to work directly with the consultant to gain her expertise in the area of literacy. Teachers worked with Mrs. Gascoyne as they analyzed their student data in both reading and writing to determine next steps for instruction tailored to meet the needs of the individual learner. On the second day, teachers met with her individually to discuss an area of focus such as guided reading and book clubs.

Working with the literacy consultant sprouted the desire for teachers to do Guided Reading with their students. PASS (Parent Association of the Sangudo Storm) was approached and agreed to fund the purchase of the Fountas and Pinnell Guided Reading program appropriate for students in approximately grades kindergarten through three. Thank you so much to PASS for your support of literacy development at SCS!

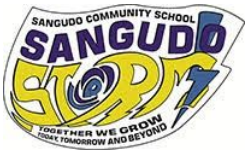

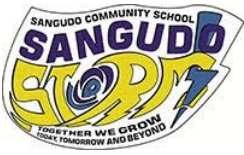
Thank you for all of your support in the previous Book Fair as we were able to earn over \$800 in Scholastic money to buy books and supplies for the school!
