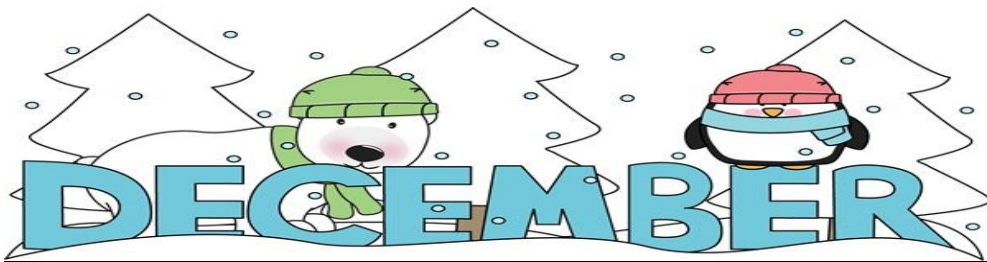


## JOLLY JINGLE SHOP
